- Collaborative Management for Watershed and Ecosystem Services Protection and Rehabilitation in the Cardamom Mountiains, Upper Prek Thnot River Basin
 - \$1.2 million of Land Degradation FA STAR allocation
 - On-farm soil and water management
 - Agro-forest and forest ecosystem restoration
 - Capacity building for watershed management

LAO PDR

- Strengthening Protection and Management Effectiveness for Wildlife and PAs
 - \$7.44 million of Biodiversity, Climate Change, Land Degradation FA STAR allocation and SFM/REDD set aside funds
 - Supporting PA management, wildlife conservation,
 REDD and sustainable forest management
 - Addressing illegal national and regional wildlife trade
 - Awareness raising and communications

Thailand

- Strengthening Capacity and Incentives for Wildlife Conservation in the Western Forest Complex
 - \$8 million of Biodiversity and Climate Change FA STAR allocation and SFM/REDD set aside funds
 - Strengthening on-ground Conservation Actions and Wildlife Protection
 - Developing and promoting incentives and sustainable financing for wildlife conservation
 - Capacity building and knowledge sharing

Viet Nam

- Integrating Biodiversity Conservation, Climate Resilience and Sustainable Forest Management in Central Annamite Landscape
 - \$4.3 million of Biodiversity and Climate Change FA STAR allocation and SFM/REDD set aside funds
 - Improving biodiversity management planning in corridor landscapes
 - Landscape conservation measures at the community level
