10th Semi-Annual Meeting of the GMS Working Group on Environment 11 November 2015, Chiang Mai, Thailand





1. Major outputs and outcomes in 2015

- NESAP formulation process began Inception workshop in November 2015
- A country environmental safeguard strengthening action plan was developed and two priority trainings are to be organized in November and December 2015
- A situational analysis for identifying potential green value chains was conducted
- ❖ A concept note on defining enabling condition on PES implementation in Cambodia was drafted
- ❖ Several other activities initiated Industrial Pollution Projection System (IPPS), eestablishment of environment information and database portal, strengthen environment communication activities and preparation of State of Environment Report



2. Key priorities for 2016

- ❖ NESAP 2016-2023 stakeholders consultations, drafting NESAP to be endorsed by NCSD and formally approved by Government
- EIA training at provincial level two more trainings to be conducted
- Preparation for establishment of TBL between Banteay Chmar Protected Landscape and Tapraya National park
- **❖** Piloting the Industrial Pollution Projection System (IPPS)
- Establishment of national environment information and database portal at MoE – using experience from Myanmar
- MoE staff to participate at training events organized through CEP regional climate change activities
- Development of State of Environment report



3. Challenges in 2016 and their solution and emerging opportunities for 2016

- MoE's restructuring completed and National Council for Sustainable Development (NCSD) established in 2015
- Institutional capacity strengthening of MoE and NCSD is urgently needed
- Environmental Code (EC) and NESAP formulation as a two-tract approach and synergy and complementarity are crucially important
- Final draft of EIA law completed but awaiting for EC formulation
- Completion of NESAP in 2016 and prioritized sectors to be addressed in the action plan
- Conduct strategic environmental assessment in the energy sector



- 4. From the country perspective, how can CEP further engage in the RIF process?
- Implement the quarterly coordinating meeting between EOC and NSU
- Technical assistance from EOC/CEP on multi-sectoral planning – SPCR and CCCA and other overall national environment strategy and plan
